personal income tax deduction reduces the general fund revenue of the State, thereby reducing SB 1 funds in years that the State reaches its 6% spending limit, or HB 1310 funds in years that SB 1 is "fully funded" and the State reaches its 4% reserve requirement. Reductions to SB 1 funds impact CDOT dollar-for-dollar. Reductions to HB 1310 funds impact CDOT \$.67 per dollar through HUTF transfers. Only in years that the 6% trigger is not reached would an income tax deduction have no direct impact to CDOT. Yet in those years, the reduced revenue would directly impact the general fund. 32-18-108 (1)(b) states that sales tax revenue generated by forest improvement districts may be used to establish financial incentives for private landowners to mitigate wildfire risks on their property. CDOT cannot estimate the reduced revenue resulting from wildfire mitigation income tax deductions, though deductions are limited to \$15,000 per landowner per year. However, CDOT notes that absent any requirement of the districts to contribute their own funds to such projects, the potential for participation and district approval of such projects is very high. The department believes this bill could measurably impact general fund revenue.
