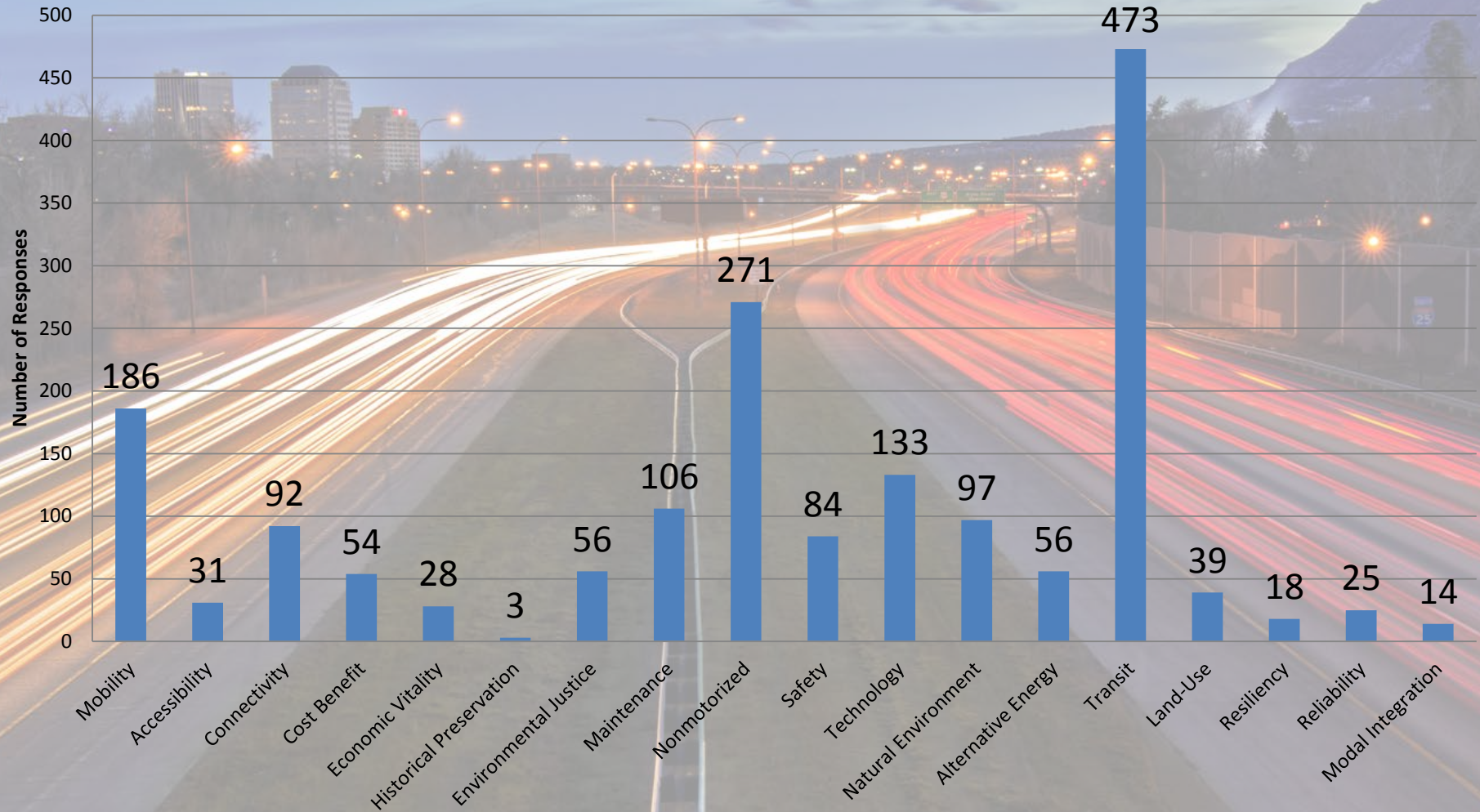

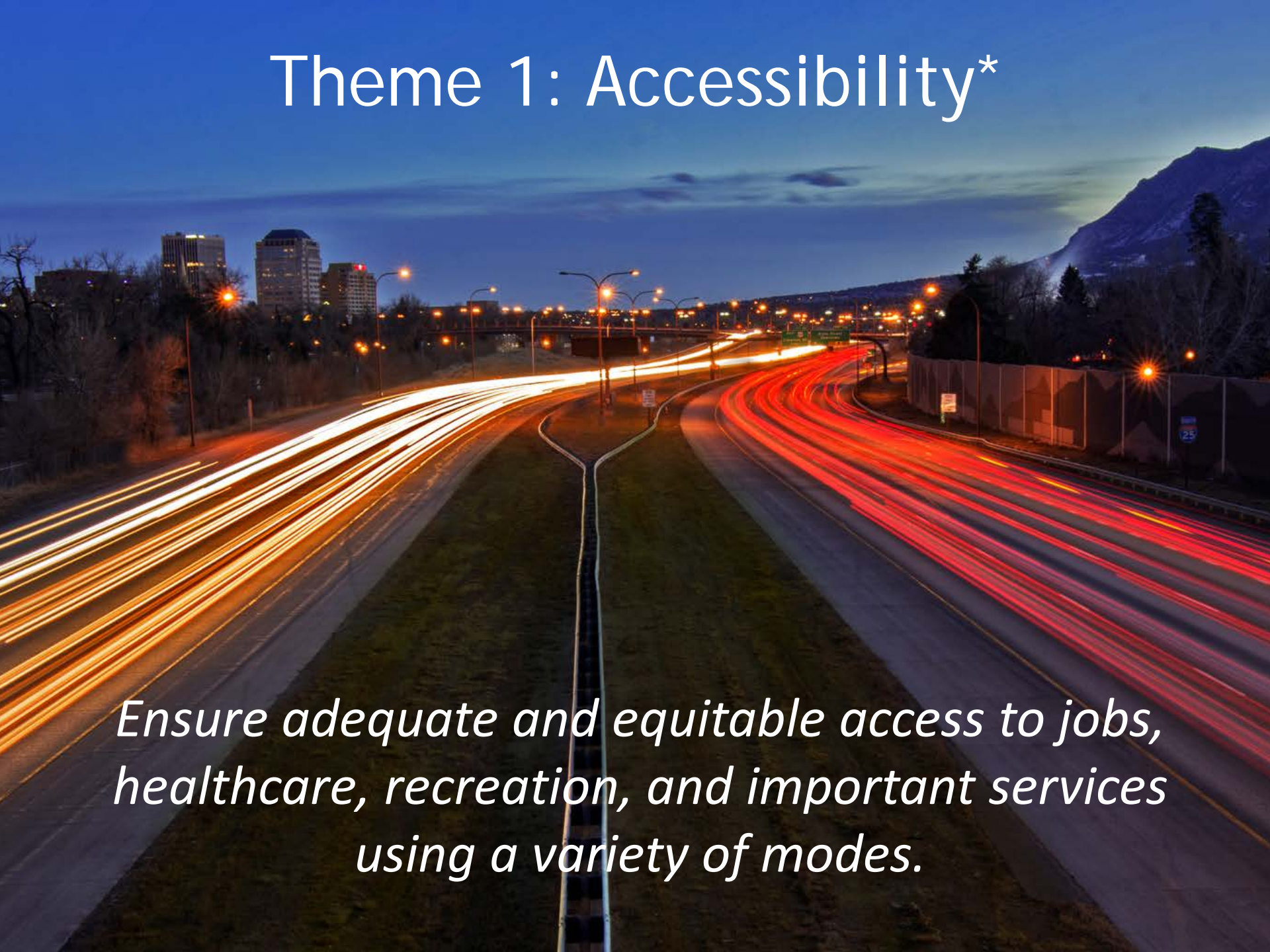

Themes mentioned in open-ended questions



Theme 1: Accessibility*

Ensure adequate and equitable access to jobs, healthcare, recreation, and important services using a variety of modes.



Theme 2: Alternative Energy*

Plan, prepare for and support alternative energy vehicles and associated infrastructure.



Theme 3: Connectivity



Reduce travel distance for all modes.

Connectivity was a 2040 goal

Enhance transportation system connectivity within and between types of travel to help improve accessibility for all travelers



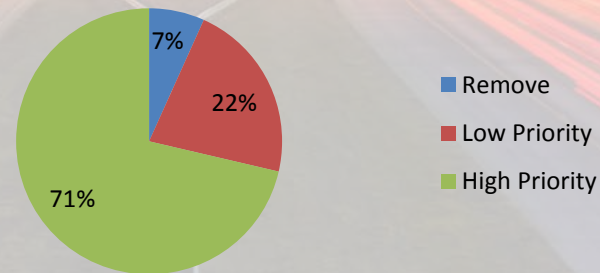
Theme 4: Cost-Effectiveness



Prioritize projects with higher life-cycle cost effectiveness.

Cost-Effectiveness was a 2040 goal

Prioritize funding of transportation projects and programs that are highly cost effective over their life cycle



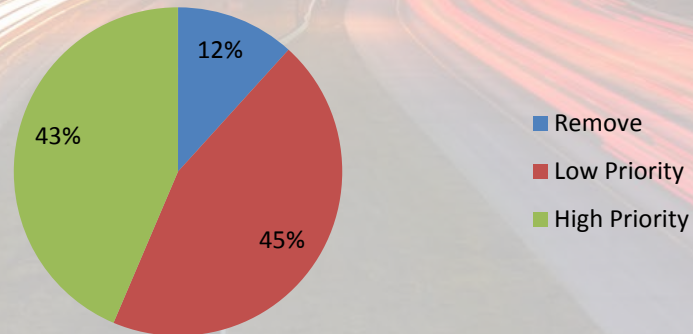
Theme 5: Economic Vitality/Tourism



Support tourism, encourage business and real estate investment, and connect communities through transportation investments.

Economic Vitality was a 2040 goal

Improve economic vitality and freight movement in the region by enhancing the transportation system



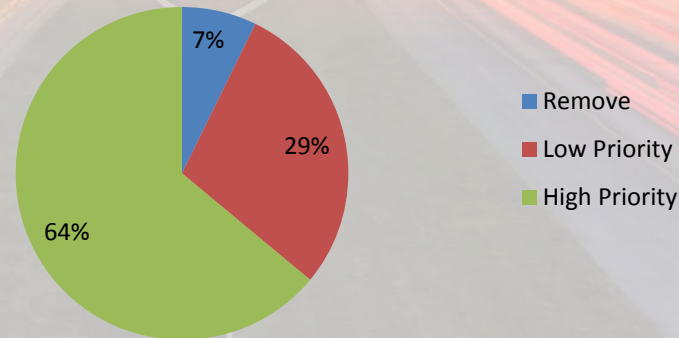
Theme 6: Equity



Ensure that transportation projects benefit and do not have a disproportionate negative impact on low income, minority and senior populations.

Equity was a 2040 goal

Ensure transportation system investment benefits are equitably distributed to minorities and citizens with disabilities, low incomes, and/or have other special needs



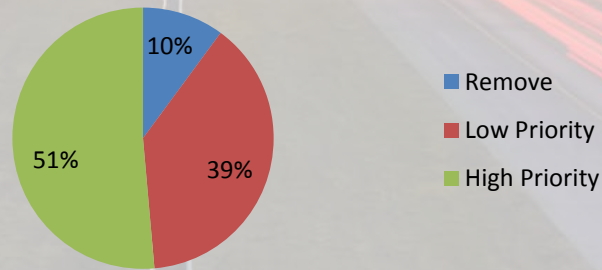
Theme 7: Historic Preservation



Preserve, revitalize and showcase historic transportation districts and modes.

Historic Preservation was a 2040 goal

Reduce transportation related adverse impacts to communities, neighborhoods, natural environments, and areas identified for cultural and/or historical preservation



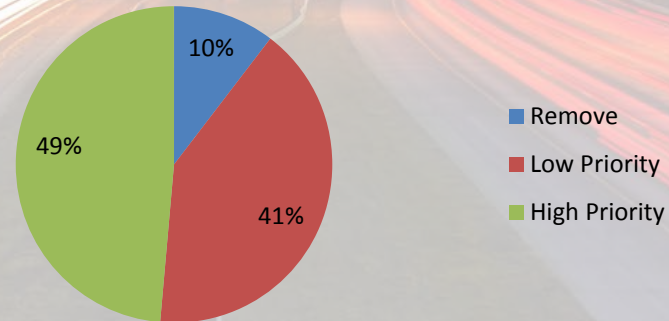
Theme 8: Land Use




Incentivize development and redevelopment in existing communities.

already-developed areas



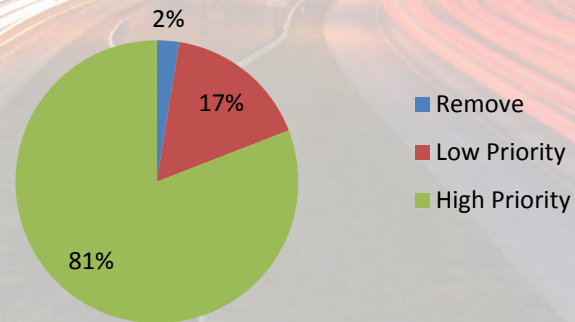
Theme 9: Maintenance



Preserve the condition of the existing transportation network, including roads, bridges, transit, and non-motorized facilities.

Maintenance was a 2040 goal

Maintain or improve the condition of existing transportation infrastructure



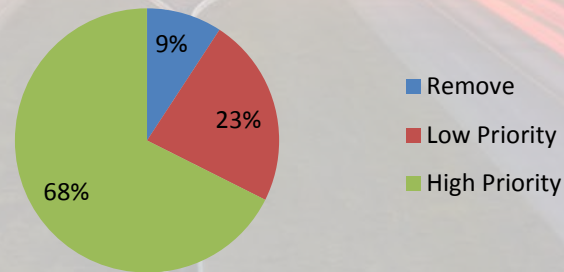
Theme 10: Mobility



Provide for the efficient movement of people and goods by managing congestion through new capacity projects, smart infrastructure, and encouraging innovative alternatives to single occupant vehicle travel.

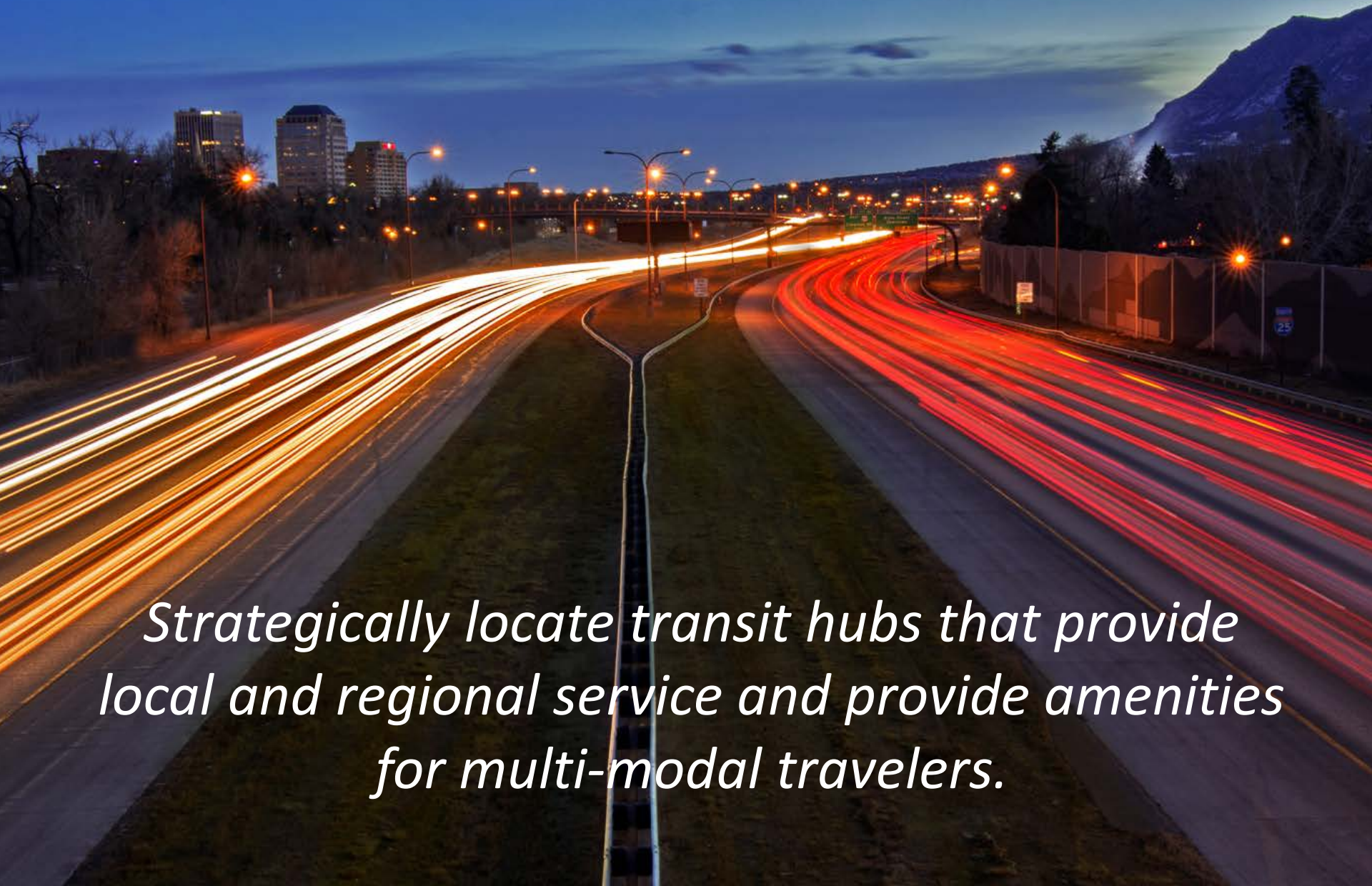
Mobility was a 2040 goal

Improve the operation of transportation systems and services to enhance emergency response, minimize travel times, and maximize service quality of all modes of commercial and private travel throughout the region



Theme 11: Modal Integration*

Strategically locate transit hubs that provide local and regional service and provide amenities for multi-modal travelers.



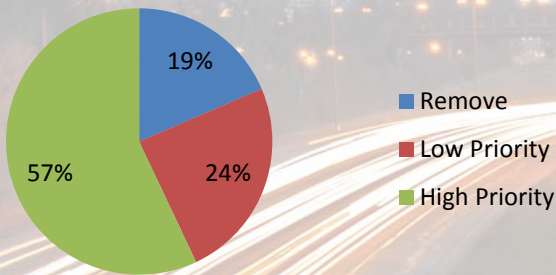
Theme 12: Natural Environment



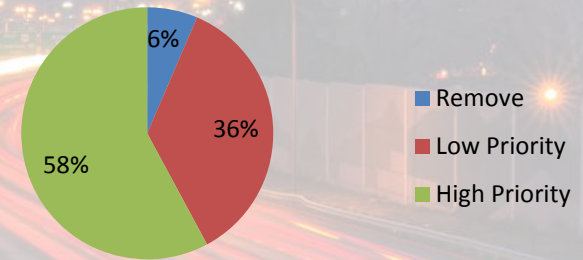
Maintain or improve air and water quality, preserve open space, and protect critical habitat areas.

Natural Environment was a 2040 goal

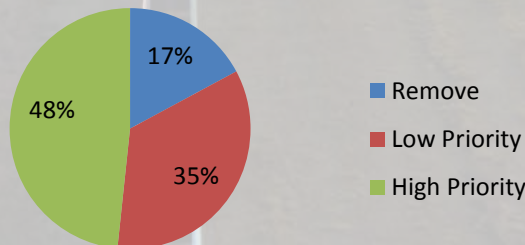
Reduce transportation related greenhouse gas and federally designated criteria air pollutant emissions



Minimize the amount of transportation related storm water runoff and pollutants that enter the region's water bodies



Improve, protect and mitigate impacts to critical habitats and connecting corridors suitable for threatened, endangered, and imperiled species



Theme 13: Non-Motorized*

Enhance the region's bicycling and walking opportunities through non-motorized infrastructure projects.

Theme 14: Reliability*

Ensure predictable travel times for transit and personal vehicle travel.



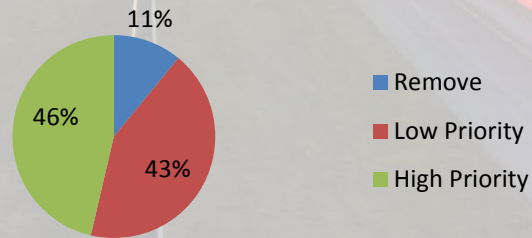
Theme 15: Resiliency/Redundancy



Provide alternative routes that improve emergency response and every day operations.

Resiliency/Redundancy was a 2040 goal

Increase resiliency and redundancy of the transportation system (i.e. reduce the percentage of transportation corridors at high risk without a viable alternative route)



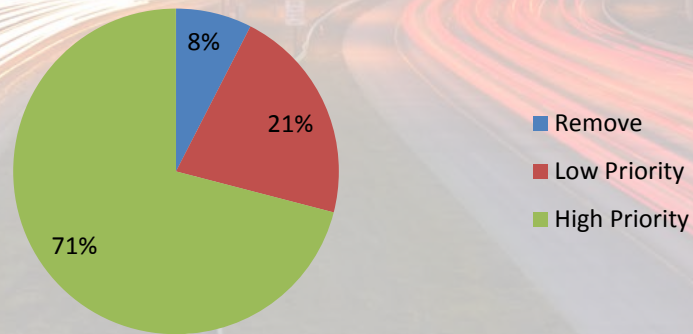
Theme 16: Safety



Improve safety for all modes of travel.

Safety was a 2040 goal

Theme 17: Technology*

Plan and prepare for the impacts of new technology on the region's transportation system, while encouraging innovation and investment.
