5. **Training/Information Sharing/Coordination Opportunities**

Mountain Metro has Zero Fare for Better Air in the month of August. SB22-180 provided the grant funding to help improve air quality.

Ms. DeAnna Rumsey with The Independence Center hosted the Lt. Governor the previous week for July's Disability Pride Month festival.

Teller County Senior Coalition hired drivers and got a new vehicle. They found that to check driver backgrounds they must now fill out a form and send it in with a check vs. just going online.

Downtown Partnership is working on their Downtown Environmental Sustainability Plan.

CDOT has finished year-end activities and is beginning to schedule site visits.



City of Fountain also doing Zero Fare for Better Air and brought some PT drivers into FT.

Ms. Laura Crews shared two Needs Assessment Focus Groups are complete. CDOT Supercall is open but deadline for new applicants has closed.

Ms. Melissa Marts announced the Pikes Peak Area Agency on Aging is beginning their Four Year Plan review. They are seeking a location for reaching the Latino community that has older adults or caregivers.

Tri-County Study Presentation. Mr. Jason O'Brien with PPACG gave the overview of findings. This study focused on multi-modal long range transit needs for all three PPACG counties. Prior studies have been on the smaller geographic region of the MPO. Recommended needs included: connecting Park and Teller with urban areas and specialized services, first and last mile options, travel on Hwy 24 and streamlining funding. There were 88 projects presented and 25 were selected to work on implementation. The list of projects can be found on the PPACG website. They are developing a funding plan and grant inventory to help with implementation.

Next month's MCC will vote on projects to submit for \$50,000 grant funding from the El Paso County Needs Assessment findings.
